

PEDAGOGICAL FOUNDATIONS OF THE USE OF GAME AND MUSICAL ELEMENTS IN THE PREPARATION OF MASS CELEBRATIONS

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ABSTRACT

The article is devoted to the study of pedagogical approaches to the use of game and musical elements in the preparation of mass celebrations. - 5. The principle of emotional response: it is necessary to select such game and musical elements that can evoke positive emotions and interest participants, helping to create an atmosphere of celebration and fun.

Currently, it is very important to revive the continuity of generations, to give children moral principles, patriotic sentiments that are alive in the older generation. The ruthless cutting off of one's roots from the nationality in the educational process leads to lack of spirituality.

The folk game has the whole arsenal of necessary tools for the formation of a human Citizen, a Patriot of his Homeland. There is practically no such significant positive personality quality that cannot be developed with the help of folk games (it is only necessary to consider it from the standpoint of the most important pedagogical tasks). Folk games and their manifestation in everyday life and on holidays are the most important kind of school of life. They do not require special gaming equipment.

Various holidays, mass entertainment, seasonal and professional rituals of great social importance occupy an important place in the spiritual heritage of the Uzbek people. Holidays and rituals represent a certain cycle covering all aspects of a person's social and personal life, manifested in various forms in interpersonal relationships and preserved in the form of traditions and rituals, a set of moral principles and historically established legal norms.

The essential features and peculiarities of these norms and principles are their constancy and mass character, repeatability in their development, duration and continuity.

Folk rituals, which have become traditional, create moral and ethical foundations for the comprehensive development of personality. These foundations are based on the mandatory norms of customary law (adat), adopted and established over the centuries, which has become a legal form of unwritten laws in the East, including in Uzbekistan, partially observed to this day. As is known, in ancient times, not only among the Eastern peoples, but also among the Romano-Germanic tribes in Europe, the norms of customary law had the force of law.

There are public holidays, traditions and rituals that have passed the test of time and are rooted in the everyday life of Uzbeks and other peoples of Central Asia. They reflect all the best in a person, truly national and universal values.

These traditions and rituals of the people express their national spirit, their thinking and consciousness, character traits and psychology. Positive customs and traditions that have been formed over the centuries and carefully preserved, such as devotion to relatives, respect for elders, care for parents, orphans and the elderly, hospitality, mutual support of relatives, the desire to protect the honor of the family and the dignity of women, the preservation of the bright memory of deceased relatives and friends are vividly expressed in folk festivals and rituals, having a public character.

The social tradition of mutual support is important for the Uzbek: preventing close people from falling into poverty, hunger, ruin and vagrancy. If such a person appears, it is considered a disgrace to all relatives and friends, fellow villagers.

One of the most widespread and attractive folk festivals among Uzbeks, which have become national, are seasonal holidays. According to some researchers, Uzbek seasonal celebrations should be classified as follows:

- 1) winter parties or clubs (gap-gashtak, yasa-yusun);
- 2) spring holidays Navruz and shohmoylar (yoke of oxen in a plow, i.e. the beginning of plowing), holidays of tulips (lola) and roses (dogwood hum), loy tutish (supply of clay, i.e. the beginning of the construction of a house), the rain calling ceremony (sust khotin), etc.;
- 3) of the summer celebrations "kovun saili" (melon festival), "choi momo", etc. are popular;
- 4) autumn holidays related to harvesting Mehrjon, oblbaraka, shamol chakirish, "uzum saili" (grape festival), etc.[2,p.35]
